






fair amount of work, sandwiches of various types and by special request some vegemite sandwiches.




When it was announced on the bus there were all types of sandwiches the biggest cheer was for the vegemite ones! Saying "We love vegemite."

Guest Speaker





• President Vince introduced George Belperio (not related). George was involved initially with Fasta Pasta and is now the Chair of Variety Bash SA.

• George spoke on the two things that have been a big part of his life:-Namely Fasta Pasta and the <u>Variety Club</u>.

Fasta Pasta was born in the basement of a premises in Pirie St in 1984, its head office is in Adelaide and it is now franchised with stores in SA, Vic and Qld. George's family came out to Australia when he was only 4yo in 1968 and he grew up on this side of town at Glynde Lewis Rd/ Edward St. He was on the management committee in the 90's when they built this beautiful club here at San Giorgio. After school he had some odd jobs, worked 4 yrs at the ATO but the best thing he learnt was from 16-23 yo when he worked making pizzas and waiting on tables. He loved hospitality. In 1979 a gentleman & fellow worker by the name of Walter Ventura convinced him to open a restaurant together called La Mensa and that changed his life. From there with an additional partner, they opened another restaurant across the road La Fresco. They went from strength to strength, appealing to the public with their fresh and modern restaurant themes and new ideas. Eventually Fasta Pasta was born and grew to what it is today. George then spoke on how he got involved with Variety way back in 2000, it's history and the good work it does for children.

Origins of the Variety Charity: Way back in 1927 eleven men involved in the show business industry met each week at a social club named the "Variety Club". On Christmas Eve, a baby girl was left abandoned on the club's doorstep at the Sheridan Square Film Theatre in Pittsburgh with a note which read:


"Please take care of my baby. Her name is Catherine. I can no longer take care of her. I have eight others. My husband is out of work. She was born on Thanksgiving Day. I have always heard of the goodness of showbusiness people and pray to God that you will look after her. Signed, a heartbroken mother."



Despite an extensive search, the mother was never found. The men informally adopted the baby and named her Catherine Variety Sheridan. They paid for Catherine's education and upbringing. This prompted the club to start raising funds for other disadvantaged children and Variety – the Children's Charity was born.

It has 44 offices worldwide and it has been 35 years in Australia with SA Variety one of the most successful Charities per funds raised.....






