ROTARY INTERNATIONAL SERVICE PROJECTS NOT USING A GLOBAL OR DISTRICT GRANT

Some clubs have proceeded with international service without using a Rotary Grant. This may have been due to the urgent nature of the need not fitting into a grant timeline, the project's small dollar amount, or the work involved in putting together an application. Some examples of projects include:

NEEDS ASSESSMENT — The Rotary Club of Penticton Sunrise solely funded a needs assessment prior to submitting a Global Grant application for their latest project in Bangladesh. The club felt that there was some urgency and therefore it did not fit into a District Grant timeline.

Contribution: \$3,160 USD.

POLIO PLUS CONTRIBUTIONS - Many Rotary Clubs and individual members contribute annually to the Rotary Foundation's Polio Plus Campaign. An example is the Rotary Club of Princeton who contribute \$1,000 annually to Polio Plus, in addition to personal donations by club members.

PROJECT AMIGO CANADA SOCIETY – The Rotary Club of Osoyoos donated to this project which supports the poor children of Colima, Mexico by providing educational opportunities, material support, enrichment activities, and medical services.

Contribution: \$5,000 USD.

ROTARY SHELTER BOX — Multiple clubs contribute annually towards the purchase of Shelter Boxes that are used in disaster responses. Each Shelter Box provides a large tent and the supplies needed for survival. An example is the Rotary Club of Penticton Sunrise who budget for a minimum of one shelter box each year.

Contribution: \$1,200 per box.

WORLD NEIGHBOURS CANADA – The Rotary Club of Oliver has committed to four annual contributions of \$4,000 each to install toilets and water reticulation systems in Nepal.

Contribution: 4 X \$4,000 = \$16,000.
