

### Rotary Club Midday of San Miguel de Allende's Mobile Library

This is the second article about the development and use of the Mobile Library, a project initiated by the Rotary Midday Club of San Miguel de Allende and CASA, the Center for the Adolescents of San Miguel de Allende.

### Final development of the Vehicle

The vehicle, a Chevrolet RAM Promaster 2500, was bought in Morelia, Michoacán. The vehicle was delivered to Ferbel, a company in San Juan del Rio, which specializes in turning standard vehicles into specialized vehicles such as ambulances, police vehicles etc. The design of the mobile library vehicle was undertaken in a cooperation between CASA and Rotary. The subsequent work of Ferbel was of a quality which impressed both the Rotary and the CASA people paying several visits to ferbel during the fitting process. The Ferbel staff was extremely cooperative and came forward with several good ideas for small betterments of the design. On September 10 the Mobile Library, with a proper interim license plate, was taken from ferbel to CASA's premises in San Miguel de Allende.





During the following days the Mobile Library was "studied" by CASA staff and even paid a visit to a rural village, where the young children had the opportunity to get acquainted with the new library.

### **Inauguration of the Mobile Library**

On September 14 the official inauguration took place at CASA. Approximately 50 adults and a similar number of 5-8 years old children participated. Among the adults were 4 representatives from Rotary District 5240 in California. They came from clubs being the major financial sponsors to the project.

Initially CASA staff members gave a presentation on the various aspects of the work of CASA and the library. Subsequently a choir of the children performed several songs plus the ceremony paying tribute to the Mexican flag and national hymn, all very moving. Finally the head of the library Claudia Varela and the Rotary project manager Ivar Schacke each gave their perspective of the project.

Then was the time to go outside to admire the vehicle inside and outside. The admiration was total and expressed in words such as "fabulous", "impressive", "unique". Many photos were taken, of which some appear below.

Finally it was time to enjoy snacks and drinks.





### World Polio Day reviews the bold steps taken to end polio

Rotary and its partners in the <u>Global Polio Eradication Initiative</u> (GPEI) have had to take bold action in the historic fight to eradicate polio. At Rotary's 6th annual <u>World Polio Day</u> event on 24 October in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, USA, highlighted the monumental and innovative steps that are getting us closer to our goal. We also celebrated 30 years of achievements by the GPEI.

In 1988, when Rotary and its partners founded the GPEI, the paralyzing disease affected 350,000 children. Our collaboration with the <u>World Health Organization</u>, <u>UNICEF</u>, the <u>U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention</u>, and later the <u>Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation</u>, local health workers, and national governments has helped reduce the number to just 15 cases of wild poliovirus this year.



This year's event was livestreamed from <u>The College of</u>

<u>Physicians of Philadelphia</u>, known as the "birthplace of American medicine." It is one of the oldest

professional medical organizations in the United States.

Global health experts and celebrities discussed our remarkable progress toward a polio-free world. Patience Asiimwe, the protagonist of Rotary's upcoming virtual reality film, "Two Drops of Patience," introduced the movie. A sneak peek from Rotary's documentary "Drop to Zero" was also featured. Jeffrey Kluger, senior editor for Time magazine, discussed his experience traveling to Nigeria with Rotary to report on polio eradication.

World Polio Day is observed in late October to honor the birthday of Dr. Jonas Salk, who led the development of the first polio vaccine. Did your club or district host a World Polio Day event? <u>Tell us about it</u> and promote it to the world. ### **Headlines**:

- Summary of new viruses this week: Afghanistan –one wild poliovirus type 1 (WPV1) positive environmental sample. Pakistan –four WPV1 positive environmental samples. Papua New Guinea one case of circulating vaccine-derived poliovirus type 1 (cVDPV1). Nigeria two cases of circulating vaccine-derived poliovirus type 2 (cVDPV2) and seven cVDPV2 positive environmental samples. See country sections below for more details.
- As the year draws to a close, endemic and outbreak countries are making concerted efforts to
  eradicate the last strong holds of polio, by conducting large-scale immunization activities
  before the end of the year.

Afghanistan: No cases of wild poliovirus type 1 (WPV1) have been reported this week. The total numbers of WPV1 cases in 2018 is 19. One WPV1 positive environmental sample was reported this week from Jalalabad district, Nangarhar province, collected on 24 October. Nominal variations (up or down) in the number of newly-reported cases at this point of the polio endgame – although tragic for the affected children and their families – are not operationally overwhelming, especially considering the population size in the 3 remaining endemic countries (upwards of 90 million children aged less than five years). However, confirmation of even a single polio case anywhere points to remaining vaccination coverage gaps which must be filled, to achieve eradication. Pakistan: No cases of wild poliovirus type 1 (WPV1) have been reported this week. The total number of WPV1 cases in 2018 in the country now stands at eight. Four WPV1 positive environmental samples have been reported across Pakistan: one in Quetta district, Balochistan province, one each in Nowshera and Peshawar districts, Khyber Pakhtunkhwa province, and one in Lahore district, Punjab province, collection dates ranging from 11-24 October. It is important to note that cases are reported this year from only 4 districts across the country, and that no WPV cases (except one from Gadap, greater Karachi) have been reported from core reservoir areas in 2018. Nigeria: No cases of wild poliovirus type 1 (WPV1) were reported. The most recently-detected WPV1 case, from Borno state, had onset of paralysis on 21 August 2016. Two circulating vaccinederived poliovirus type 2 (cVDPV2) cases were reported this week, one from Katsina state and one from Kaduna state (newly infected district and province, part of the Jigawa outbreak) with onset of paralysis on 9 October and 10 September respectively.
