Report from the Council on Legislation

I am just returning from the 2019 Council on Legislation where I served as our district's voting delegate. The Council meets every 3 years and includes voting delegates from all 538 districts of the Rotary World.

To be a delegate, you must be a past governor and nominated by your district to represent the district for the three years leading up to and including the Council on Legislation. Each delegate is required to go through training and certification by the Council Committee and be willing to attend the 5 days that the Council on Legislation meets. The task of the Council is to review and take action on items such as changing the Rotary bylaws and Constitution based on enactments and resolutions presented by the various clubs from around the world,

When implemented, the biggest change enacted at the Council will be the inclusion of Rotaract as official members of Rotary and no longer a program of Rotary. It has not yet been decided as to the dues structure, and they will not be given an official RI membership number (unless they contribute through a Rotary club), but they will be included under the umbrella of Rotary International members. 

The other change is the approval of Rotary International to seek charitable foundation status, which will give Rotary International taxexempt status (which will include our dues). Though not yet enacted, Rotary International anticipates approval in the near future. I will be sending out a full report on the Council on Legislation through the District Newsletter and on the District website within the next few weeks. Meanwhile, here are some interesting demographic facts, based on Rotary International data, that I received at the CoL:

- The average club has 33 members
- There are 377 clubs with 5 members or less
- There are 696 satellite clubs totaling 3,800 members
- The average district has 2,219 members and 66 clubs
- 23% of Rotary members are women

CONSTRUCTING LOW COST SHELTERS USING GLOBAL GRANTS

Clubs and districts can now use global grants to build low-cost shelters and simple schools, under a recent policy change effective through 2019. The construction must be part of a comprehensive project related to an area of focus. (Projects that involve construction alone are still not eligible for global grants.)

Please note that these structures are limited. Low-cost shelters are intended to provide housing for the poor or homeless. Simple schools provide modest buildings in areas without nearby schools or where current ones are overcrowded. Simple schools can also replace schools that are structurally unsafe. As part of this program, clubs and districts can use global grants to build additional classrooms on school property as long as they are not attached to current structures.

LOW COST SHELTERS GUIDELINES

Section 1: Program Requirements

- 1. Low cost shelters are to be built as part of a comprehensive project that fits within one of Rotary's six areas of focus, with sustainable elements and training in the chosen area of focus. This will ensure the alleviation of poverty and prevent the deterioration of shelters and communities into a state of disrepair.
- 2. Projects need to include training in financial management and supplemental livelihood enhancement, such as vocational or entrepreneurship skills to ensure that occupants will be able to maintain their homes after receipt.
- 3. All projects must include adequate sanitation. Ideally projects will include toilets, sinks, electricity, and potable water on each property. In these instances, residents must also receive hygiene and sanitation training, as well as home maintenance training to provide collective upkeep of construction elements like water wells, latrine blocks, and roofs. Training must be provided by experienced professionals in the local language.
- 4. If the project provides a community toilet, applicants must answer the following questions:
 - a. Why is a community toilet a better option than individual toilets?
 - b. How many families will be sharing each community toilet?
 - c. How would land ownership of the toilet be determined?
 - d. Who is responsible for maintenance of the toilet?
 - e. Will funds be collected to pay for maintenance of the community toilet? How much will each family contribute monthly/yearly?
 - f. How far is the furthest home from the toilet?
 - g. Will the handwashing station be inside the toilet structure or free standing near each community toilet? Who will be responsible for providing soap to each community toilet?
 - h. What type of water source is available for the community toilet?
 - i. Please provide a signed agreement with the families that outlines their family's responsibilities in maintaining the toilet and related structures.

CONSTRUCTING SIMPLE SCHOOLS USING GLOBAL GRANTS

SIMPLE SCHOOLS GUIDELINES

Section 1: Program Requirements

- 1. Simple schools are an extremely limited project type that permits the construction of modest school buildings (e.g. 2-3 classrooms).
- 2. Simple schools must be built as a part of a comprehensive project that fits within the basic education and literacy area of focus. Providing a school building alone cannot educate children; in order to enhance educational outcomes, pedagogical teacher training is required as part of all simple school projects.
- 3. Only primary schools, secondary schools, and early-childhood education centers that follow a mandated government curriculum are eligible for construction. Construction of buildings for colleges, universities, vocational training centers, and community centers is not eligible for global grant funding. Additions to existing schools, such as computer labs or dormitories, are not eligible.
- 4. All simple school projects must include gender-separated toilets identified with signs, handwashing stations, electricity, and drinkable water on each property. School administrators and teachers must receive training in hygiene and sanitation and menstrual hygiene management (required only for primary and secondary schools) in order to have teachers continue to provide additional training to students after the project is complete. Simple schools must also provide bins in the girls' toilet areas for the disposal of sanitary napkins.
- 5. School maintenance personnel must receive training in the upkeep of construction elements like water wells, latrine blocks, roofs, etc. If the school does not have maintenance staff, sponsors must identify who will handle these matters and provide suitable training.
- 6. All global grant applications for simple schools must include a completed application appendix included at the end of this document.
- 7. A school management committee made up of teachers, students, school administrators, and parents must be formed to work with Rotarians to set sustainable practices for school maintenance, governance, water access, sanitation, waste management, and training. Members of the school management committee who will work with the school budgeting must receive financial management training. When possible, the committee is encouraged to work with local officials in the government's education office to create sustainable practices.
- 8. Under the Rotary Foundation Code of Policies, grants may not be used to promote political or religious viewpoints. Therefore, religious schools are ineligible for construction.
- 9. The project's sponsors should conduct a community assessment to identify the community that will receive a school.

<u>Headlines</u>:

- Co-chairs of Immunization Management Group (IMG) announced that the global goal set out in 2013 of 126-OPV using countries to introduce 1 dose of IPV in their immunization programme has been achieved.
- Eminent Islamic religious scholars from Afghanistan and Pakistan came together in Muscat, Oman for the first ever joint Ulama Conference, under the aegis of the Islamic Advisory Group (IAG). for polio eradication The IAG convened religious scholars in a bid to appreciate their value as community leaders and secure bilateral support for polio eradication efforts across the joint poliovirus transmission corridors. At the end of the two-day conference, the scholars issued a joint declaration in support of the polio efforts. - In keeping with the recommendations of the Emergency Committee under the International Health Regulations (IHR), Afghanistan and Pakistan have introduced an all-age polio vaccination for travelers crossing international borders to increase general population immunity the common wild poliovirus transmission corridor. <u>Afghanistan:</u>

- No wild poliovirus type 1 (WPV1) cases have been reported in the past week. There are three WPV1 cases reported in 2019 from Afghanistan. The total number of WPV1 cases for 2018 remains 21.
- Three WPV1-positive environmental samples were reported in the past week. The samples were collected between 23 February-23 March 2019.

<u>Pakistan:</u>

- No cases of wild poliovirus type 1 (WPV1) were reported in the past week. There are six WPV1 cases reported in 2019. The total number of WPV1 cases in 2018 remains 12.
- Three WPV1-positive environmental samples were reported in the past week. The samples were collected between 7-21 March 2019. So far in 2019, a total of 78 environmental positive samples have been reported. Full year 2018 total remains 140.

Nigeria:

- One case of circulating vaccine-derived poliovirus type 2 has been reported in the past week in Imeko Afon LGA, Ogun State. The onset of paralysis was on 9 March 2019. There are five cVDPV2 cases reported in 2019 so far. The total number of cVDPV2 cases in 2018 remains 34.
- Seven cVDPV2-positive environmental samples have been reported this week: two in Madaiguri, Borno state; one in Tarauni, Kano state; three in Lagos mainland and one in Mushin in Lagos. The samples were collected between 14 December 2018 to 19 March 2019.
- No cases of wild poliovirus type 1 (WPV1) have been reported in the country since the one detected from Borno State with a date of onset of paralysis on 21 August 2016.
