By participating in RYLA, you and your Rotary club agree to abide by and accept responsibility for following the Youth Services Policy ("Article 11") of the District 6540 By-laws to ensure the safety of the youth you are sending to participate in RYLA. Article 11 includes guidelines for youth protection and transportation and may require specific types of background checks, as necessary. A copy of Article 11 can be found on pages 10-11 in this document. A copy of Article 11 and background check information through InCheck (background check company) can also be found on the district's website. See the "files" section on the left-hand side of the RYLA page, http://ryla.rotary6540.org. You acknowledge that it is the responsibility of your Rotary club to follow Article 11 and agree to indemnify and hold harmless Rotary District 6540 and the District 6540 RYLA Committee. You also understand that the District 6540 RYLA Committee cannot monitor or ensure that clubs follow this policy.

• Online forms:

All forms are to be submitted online to us at the district. Links are updated every year. Only use the links in this year's RYLA Club Packet.

No refunds:

No refunds! This has been the policy since RYLA's inception. Your club is expected, at minimum, to follow through with its commitment per your club's RYLA Chair Report. You may send equal to or more than what you submit on your RYLA Chair Report, but not less. To avoid losing out on fees, select alternates in case your delegates cannot attend!

Useful items in this packet:

- Press Releases and Letters and Information for School Principals and Guidance Counselors are meant to make your job easier and gets your Rotary club some good publicity! These can be edited if you wish.
- Some clubs use a paper application for their interview process. Therefore, the old (preonline) paper application (page 20) is for your club only IF you want to use it. Many clubs do not use a paper application for interviews or their selection process. Increasingly, many clubs use their own online application that matches the district's, this makes for an easy copy and paste district submission. In the end, online applications for each of your RYLA delegates must be submitted to the district through the link provided in this RYLA Club Packet at rylaapplication.rotary6540.org. It is up to your RYLA Committee to decide if either you or your delegate will submit the online application!


Here are some quick steps to guide you through this process!

1. Send this information to your club's RYLA Committee RIGHT NOW.



Check your Rotary Club's budget and decide how many students you plan to send to RYLA this year.

- a. Club Presidents Read the Club President Letter on page 7!
- RYLA Committees Read the RYLA Committee Letter on page 8!
- 2. Read through this entire packet and become familiar with it as things have changed this year!
- 3. Pay attention to the strict deadlines on the RYLA Time Table, page 9.
- 4. Check out the district's website where all the pertinent RYLA links and files can be found, ryla.rotary6540.org. (You can also get to the RYLA page from the district website, www.rotary6540.org by clicking on Students & Youth, then click Rotary Youth Leadership Awards (RYLA), see below.)



5. Complete and return the RYLA Chair Report. The deadline for submitting your RYLA

Chair Report is February 2nd! The RYLA Chair Report is now online at

rylachairreport.rotary6540.org! Or you can go to the RYLA page on the district website at ryla.rotary6540.org. Then, click on RYLA Chair Report in the "links" section on the left-hand side of the page. Complete every question and hit submit at the bottom of the page.

6. <u>Submit applications and health forms with waivers online at ryla.rotary6540.org!</u> This is another big change with online registration this year.

This is a 2-step process, please have your students complete the following:

i. The online application must be completed either by a Rotarian OR the FINAL RYLA delegates that your club selects to attend RYLA. You can find this form at rylaapplication.rotary6540.org. The application still asks who the sponsoring club is, name of local RYLA Chair, and the Chair's contact info. Plan accordingly for who will fill this out. A 'copy of responses' will be sent to the email address on the top line of the form. Most Chairs will want their address entered here to know when the application is submitted. Plan accordingly!

Helpful Tip!

If your club has candidates submit a paper version of the application for the interview process (see page 16) we suggest you make a copy of this hand-written application so it can quickly and identically be submitted online.

ii. Last, the Health Form & Release must be completed by the student & their parent/guardian.

There is a link at the bottom of the application, above the "submit" button, for the Health Form and Release. It will take the person filling out the form to another website where they need to complete the Health Form and Release. The Health Form and Release can also be found at rylahealthformandrelease.rotary6540.org.

All forms need to be completed and payment received before students will be considered enrolled to RYLA. All information is needed to know how to contact the students, guardians, emergency contacts, administer medicine, deal with allergies, etc.

The Purpose

RYLA Chair Report lets us know who your Rotary club's RYLA Chair or contact person is and their contact info.

Be sure and turn this form in ASAP. If it is not submitted on time, the camp could fill up and your Rotary club could miss their chance to change the lives of future leaders in their community!

Rotary District 6540 Youth Services Policy from District By-laws

ARTICLE 11 – YOUTH POLICY

11.1. Statement of Conduct for Working with Youth

Rotary strives to create and maintain a safe environment for all youth who participate in Rotary activities. To the best of their ability, Rotarians, Rotarians' spouses and partners, and other volunteers must safeguard the children and young people they come into contact with and protect them from physical, sexual, and emotional abuse.

Given the extent of Rotary activities, any adult (Rotarian and non-Rotarian) who is involved in any Rotary sponsored program (Rotary Youth Programs) must be willing to undergo a criminal background and reference check, without reservation or parameter. This includes any activity associated with any Rotary youth program, collectively or separately, including but not limited to Rotary Youth Exchange, Rotary Youth Leadership Awards, Interact, EarlyAct, Speech Contest, Rotary Students, Rotary Scholars, or any Rotary endorsed mentoring program.

Further, anyone involved in such youth activity should expect and Clubs are authorized to do such a background check at least annually. If common knowledge is such that a person has been charged by a law enforcement agency of violating a trusted youth relationship, they shall be removed from any and all activity concerning Rotary youth programs pending the outcome of any related charges.

It is highly suggested that a person within each Rotary Club serve as a "Youth Liaison" and maintain records on ALL individuals engaged in youth connected activities for a period of at least 10 years. This includes persons, including but not limited to committee members, host families, club counselors, drivers, etc. Each person must complete and sign a Youth Volunteer Affidavit and agree to undergo a criminal background and reference check.

It is also suggested that one-on-one contact with an adult/young person be avoided to limit the opportunity for or the accusation of inappropriate behavior. The best circumstance would ensure that all activities and travel involve at least two unrelated adults.

11.2 Compliance with Youth Protection Laws and Reporting

Every Rotarian in every club must be diligent and steadfast in protecting all youth engaged in club and/or district activities. Compliance with all state and federal Youth Protection Laws is required.

Any Rotary Club involved with a child/young person who has made an allegation against a Rotarian or other adult while traveling, visiting or attending a Rotary event must report it to the District Governor immediately upon discovery. In addition, Rotary International provides the following guidelines for addressing such an issue:

- A. An independent and thorough investigation must be made into any claims of sexual abuse or harassment.
- B. Any adult involved in a Rotary youth program against whom an allegation of sexual abuse or harassment is made must be removed from all contact with youth until the matter is resolved.
- C. Any allegation of abuse must be immediately reported to the appropriate law enforcement agency, in accordance with RI's zero-tolerance policy.
- D. A club must terminate the membership of and prohibit the involvement of any Rotarian or non-Rotarian who admits to, is convicted of or is otherwise found to have engaged in sexual abuse or harassment of a

Rotary youth student. A club may not grant membership to a person who is known to have engaged in sexual abuse or harassment.

E. If an investigation into a claim of sexual abuse or harassment is inconclusive, then additional safeguards must be put in place to assure the protection of any youth with whom the individual may have future contact. Such measures should include, at a minimum, the adult being prohibited both by rule and practice, of being alone with any young person interacting on Rotary business.

Regardless of proven criminal or civil guilt on the second accusation, the adult will not be allowed to interact or engage with any youth within a Rotary context. A person who is accused but the charges are absolved may apply to be reinstated to participate in youth programs.

Reinstatement is not a right, and no guarantee is made that he or she will be reinstated to his or her former position or be allowed to have contact with the youth. (November 2006 Mtg., Bd. Dec. 72)

11.3 Travel by Youth

It is encouraged and expected that Rotary clubs be involved with various activities involving young people both locally and at the district, state, zone, and international levels. Travel to and from these events must be governed by all youth protection policies and written procedures. Such policies will govern ALL activities including those for the Youth Exchange program.

Rotary Clubs are encouraged to limit travel extended by Rotarians to students to a minimum. If possible, rely on teachers, parents, grandparents, etc. to transport students. Rotarians should be used as a last resort.

If students are transported by Rotarians, the Club is required to have an established process for determining the worthiness of volunteers, including but not limited to, a volunteer application; proof of auto insurance; a criminal and driving record background check, and other reasonable means deemed appropriate by the Club to ensure youth are protected from harm while in their care. If the Rotarian is employed by a public school system, it is assumed that the school's youth program is sufficient and no further action is required.

- A. Written permission slips must be signed by the parents or guardians of all youth participants for all travel extended by a Rotarian or Rotary program. Such permission slip should relay that the Rotarian providing transport is not a professional driver and Rotary retains no liability. Additional information regarding emergency medical care should also be requested. *See attached sample. Copies of the permission slips should be retained by the adult in charge of the student as well as the Club Secretary, per previously stated guidelines in this policy.
- B. Rotarians transporting students must be free of significant past driving infractions or impaired driving charges. Anyone known to have had a DUI (Driving Under the Influence {of drugs or alcohol), OWI (Operating while intoxicated), reckless driving, or other such charge within the past 5 years shall be PROHIBITED from transporting students or young people. Review of Rotarian driver records should be kept up to date via newsfeeds, common knowledge, and/or formal background checks at least annually.
- C. All parents or legal guardians are to be given complete details regarding the program, location, travel itineraries, sleeping accommodations and contact information of the responsible adults associated with the program BEFORE departure.
- D. If travel is more than 150 miles away from the home club, each young person must obtain travel insurance to include medical coverage, emergency medical evacuation, repatriation of remains, and legal liability, as applicable, in amounts satisfactory to the club or district organizing the activity or event, with coverage from the time of the minor's departure from his/her residence until their return home.

RYLA: The Award

An <u>intensive</u> youth leadership training experience.

<u>Each delegate should visit your club meeting</u> to meet your Rotarians and gain a better sense of Rotary in your community prior to the conference.

As soon as possible after the conference, the award certificates should be presented during your Rotary meeting.

The Aim

To recognize, encourage, and educate youth leaders.

The Purpose

To demonstrate Rotary's respect and concern for youth.

To encourage, assist, and train leaders in responsible and effective youth leadership.

To encourage continued and stronger leadership of youth-by-youth

To publicly recognize the high qualities of youth who are rendering service to their communities as young leaders.

The Plan

We request that each club select high school students (usually sophomores and juniors) to attend the camp. To do this, the students must complete an application. Your RYLA committee must select delegates and alternates and your club must pay the cost of the camp for each student.

Interview Selection and Closing Date

Please send the delegate applications and payment by March 15, 2024. No refunds.

The local Rotary Club RYLA Committee (3 to 5 Rotarians under the leadership of an enthusiastic chair) should select the students to receive the award. Applications must be submitted by the student and approved by the student's parent or guardian. Health forms and releases need to be electronically signed by the student's parent or guardian. Each student should be interviewed by the committee before being approved. Make sure the students commit themselves to attend the entire camp. We cannot have students missing part of the camp (due to logistical nightmares and missed opportunities). Your money will not be returned for no-shows.

It is important that the selection of the students be carried out very carefully. The student shall be of the highest standard obtainable within the club's area. The basis will include reference to character, general education, leadership qualities, record of service to their school and community, and have the potential for wise leadership of their peers in the future. Students, for example, may be selected from school, church, YMCA, YWCA, 4-H, Boy and Girl Scouts, and other worthy youth organizations. Sons and daughters of Rotarians are eligible. The selection will reflect upon the local Rotary Club as well as the district.

Select students <u>first</u> for their leadership potential, <u>second</u> for good citizenship, <u>third</u> for desire to attend the conference, and <u>fourth</u> for scholarship. <u>These characteristics are listed in order so that talented leaders are not overlooked because of grades. Talented leaders are good, conscientious students who <u>are creative and resourceful.</u> Academic standing is important, but not necessarily the #1 characteristic of effective and charismatic leaders.</u>

Please submit the applications of selected students and \$300 per student by March 15th.

For this reason, the 58 Rotary Clubs in District 6540 will conduct the 35 th annual Rotary Youth Leadership Award Camp at Camp Tecumseh YMCA Outdoor Camp, Brookston, Indiana from April 19 th – April 21 st 2024. It will be staffed by carefully selected professional counselors. Our objective is to offer outstanding high school sophomores and juniors an opportunity to live, work, and play together in an atmosphere of friendly competition which will offer a challenge to accept the responsibilities of leadership. Much of each student's time will be structured with programs such as group discussions, guest speakers, career guidance, and group sports. Perhaps the greatest benefit will come from sharing this experience with 130 outstanding young men and women from high schools in northern Indiana.
Our Rotary Club is asking you to <u>nominate students</u> who have already displayed leadership abilities and who will profit most from this experience. We suggest they be selected first for leadership potential, second for good citizenship, third for desire to attend the camp, and fourth for scholarship.
Please give the attached memo to students that you think will be good candidates.
Nominations should be made and the names given to no later than Our Rotary Committee will then interview the students and select the delegates and alternates.
We hope the selection for the camp will become a regular part of your award system .

This is Rotary Youth Leadership Awards (RYLA)

(Information for Principals, Guidance Counselors, and Interact Sponsors)

History

RYLA began in District 960, Queensland, Australia.

By 1966, the Rotary Youth Leadership Award program had spread to two more districts. Then it "took off" and within another three years, it was being operated in every district in Australia and New Zealand.

In 1971, Rotarians from Australia and New Zealand cheered enthusiastically when the Rotary International president announced, at the International Convention in Sydney, that RYLA had been adopted by the board of Rotary International as an official youth program.

RYLA seminars are being conducted now in many countries. Our Rotary District 6540 (northern 1/3 of Indiana) has conducted RYLA for over 30 years!

Objectives

To demonstrate Rotary's respect and concern for youth.

To encourage, assist, and train leaders in responsible and effective youth leadership.

To encourage continued and stronger leadership of youth by youth

To publicly recognize the high qualities of youth who are rendering service to their communities as young leaders.

The Award

RYLA is not a normal type of award.

The Rotary Youth Leadership Award entitles the recipient to take part in the annual **RYLA camp** as the **guest** of their local Rotary Club.

Apart from attending the RYLA camp, the awardees receive a **certificate** to mark the occasion and will be **invited to their sponsoring Rotary Club** before and after the camp. The camp is a Friday through Sunday live-in program conducted by **highly trained**, **experienced leaders representing a wide range of vocations**.

What is the Rotary Youth Leadership Award?

(Information for students)

To become a RYLA delegate you must show leadership potential in your school, church, extracurricular activities, or your community. You must be recommended by your principal, guidance counselor, or a Rotarian for an interview by your local Rotary Club RYLA Committee who will select the delegates and alternates.

If you are selected, you will attend your local Rotary Club to become acquainted with the local Rotarians and get a better understanding about Rotary.

Your <u>transportation</u> to and from the camp, and <u>all expenses</u>, will be provided by your local Rotary Club. The camp will take place <u>April 19th – April 21st 2024</u>.

You must (and will want to) attend the <u>ENTIRE</u> camp. You will experience three exciting days <u>making new friends</u>, <u>learning</u>, <u>competing</u>, <u>and having fun while</u> working to increase your leadership abilities.

You will hear from outstanding humorists and speakers.

You will participate in networking, leadership development exercises, group dynamics and team building initiatives, and problem solving. This series of mentally and physically challenging situations build group cohesiveness and character, and will give you the opportunity to use your humor, intellect, and problem solving skills.

You will attend and participate in a campfire and be in group skits.

You will not, however, get much sleep!

RYLA Information and Rules

- 1. All RYLA participants must be transported to and from the conference.

 Participants are NOT allowed to have cars in camp. Similarly, RYLA participants should have no outside visitors during the course of the conference. Students must attend the ENTIRE camp.
- 2. As representative of their local Rotary Clubs, all RYLA participants must see that no willful misuse or destruction of equipment or property of the conference site takes place.
- 3. Please plan to check in promptly between 9:30 and 10:30 so the opening session may begin at 11:00.
- 4. Emergency phone messages may be left at 765-564-2898. This is a business line and may not be used for social calls.
- 5. Each RYLA participant is assigned to a group sharing a modern lodge with restroom and shower facilities. A counselor will be supervising the group. Lights out at 12:00.
- **7.** Medications will be turned into Camp Tecumseh staff at check-in and dispensed by camp staff as prescribed.
- 8. Alcoholic beverages and non-prescription drugs are not permitted on camp property. Smoking on camp grounds is prohibited. <u>Use of cell phones, etc. is prohibited (except for pictures). You may also use phones to call parents/guardians. If used for other purposes, they will be confiscated.</u>
