 Knowledge — Technical knowledge is vital in order to develop meaningful projects. The project team needs a thorough understanding of Rotary Foundation guidelines and resources, including <u>A Guide to Global Grants</u>, the <u>Community Assessment</u> <u>Tools</u> handbook, and the eligibility criteria found in the <u>Area of</u> <u>Focus Policy Statements</u>.

Members of the Cadre have been able to carry out evaluations of global grant projects despite travel suspensions caused by the COVID-19 pandemic. Through November to January of this Rotary year, Cadre member Marcel van Opstal met virtually from Colombia with the sponsors of a community economic development project in Ecuador. The project, sponsored by the Rotary clubs of Quito, Pichincha, Ecuador, and Zürich-Knonaueramt, Switzerland, remodeled a building for a fish market and a food services facility for fishing industry workers in Bahía de Caráquez, Manabí, Ecuador.
