Besides providing dairy products, cows produce calves that farmers in Cambodia can sell to support their families.

Children are using digital media for all sorts of purposes. By purchasing books to be used on smart phones, pads, etc., we give them the option of doing something more enriching than just playing games.

\$1,000 - 32 Eye Surgeries (Paul Harris Fellowship)

In India, Pakistan, and Bangladesh, simple eye surgeries have given people back their eyesight forever.

\$1,000 - Scholarship (Paul Harris Fellowship)

A thousand dollars goes a long way to ease the financial burden for a deserving student in their first year at college.

\$5,500 - Youth Exchange - Send a local high school student overseas for a school year.

\$5,500 - Rachel's Challenge - This anti-bullying project has had great success at all educational levels making schools a better place for learning and growing.

\$11,000 - 3-month Training in Peace and Conflict Resolution (Rotary Major Donor)

Sometimes called Rotary's most important program, we can send a local professional in a peace-related field to a university Rotary Peace Center for practical skill development.

\$11,000 - Soccer League (Rotary Major Donor)

Keep kids off the street and help them develop self-worth through this sports mentoring activity.
