#### Payment of RI and District Dues

#### Rotary International

RI dues are invoiced semi-annually based on reported membership to RI as of July 1 and January 1. Clubs will receive a one page invoice in July and January either by email or mail. The membership count cannot be changed. If your club has not received an invoice by July 31, contact Rotary.

Payment is due upon receipt but no later than July 31 and January 31. Clubs are delinquent if dues are not paid within 120 days and are subject to charter revocation.

# Doing Good in the World You could mean the World to someone

\$100. Just \$100, can make a World of difference in the health and economic well being of millions of girls and women, and their families, by merely providing safe water through a local well.

If it is important to you that adult women worldwide have the opportunity to become economically independent, then you should donate \$100 to the Rotary Foundation. The duty to collect fresh water commonly falls on adult women. Can you image walking miles one way to the water source with a large empty container and then turn around and walk back with the same container filled with water? And repeat this every day, no matter the terrain, the distance, the temperature or weather conditions. Not only is it difficult to stabilize and control water filled containers, it is very heavy. As the miles creep by, the effort of these women is increasingly strenuous. We take for granted that fresh water will pour out with the mere turn of a knob. Well it could not be more different for millions of people worldwide.

What's \$100 to create the opportunity for these co-citizens of the World to redirect their time and effort to earn-



ing a living for their family? If you care, give \$100 per year by signing up for Every Rotarian Every year at rotary.org.

If you believe young girls will see a better future if they attend school, then you should donate \$100 to the Rotary Foundation. Often young girls in third world countries drop out of school so that they can retrieve water under the same conditions described above. This is a daily grind, so that it is impossible for these girls to attend school. That means they are uneducated adults, forever continuing generational poverty. If you want to make a life long impact on the life of young girls, ask your club to institute a practice of billing

members \$10 per month so that you and your club can make a difference in the World. Or donate directly to Rotary through Every Rotarian Every Year.

If it's important that your club be a part of Worldwide philanthropy in deed, not just word, then encourage your officers, directors and fellow club members to support the donation of club funds to the installation of a water well in a well-deserving community. This is easily accomplished by co-funding a Rotary global grant.
