AUSTRALIA DAY 2022 - THE LAUNCH OF ROTARY ADOPT-A-TREE

An opportunity for Rotary Clubs to demonstrate their support of the environment and desire to help grow our *communities*

Australia Day will see the *launch* of the Rotary Adopt-A-Tree Project

This will also be the <u>*launch*</u> of Rotary Smith Family Scholarships, again demonstrating Rotary's involvement in the growth of our communities

- Six clubs along with District, on behalf of the clubs in the District, have been successful with the NADC grants @ \$20,000 each
 Environment theme is the focus with 100% sustainable, carbon neutral trees, containing saplings in biodegradable pots sitting in holed branches with additional florae to give colour and fullness to the 3 metre trees
- ✓ This project is planned to be standalone but can be carried out in conjunction with other Australia Day activities that clubs are planning. It will require minimal manning by each club over the two days of Australia Day
- The Project can proceed via social media and email if Covid restrictions arise

- ✓ This will be an ongoing project where all Clubs can engage with their local community by selling adoption of trees that will be planted in Bush Fire ravaged zones, such as the Hawkesbury and the South Coast
- ✓ Details of Rotary Clubs existing tree planting projects can be placed on the website
- ✓ Trees can be adopted for \$5.00 each
- ✓ QR codes will be used to go to webpage to donate
- Paypal is currently being setup by District to use for this and other District Projects

✓ In the week prior to Australia Day, each AG grouping

- (including Rotaract) will be provided with a marketing kit including signs, brochures, collection buckets, clip boards, pens, flyers to hand out, etc
- ✓ Please use selfie frames and pull up banners from last year if available
- ✓ After adopting a tree, members of the community and businesses will be sent a numbered Adoption Certificate

✓ After the trees are propagated details will be sent out regarding when the mass planting days will occur, inviting them to be involved if they wish

- Numbered trees will be able to be located on a map on the website
- ✓Other organisations, such as Scouts, Schools, and Sports Clubs will also be invited to participate in mass plantings, as required
- ✓Links to local Rotary Clubs will be available on the website

- ✓ Appoint a Key Contact person and send contact details to <u>barryantees@gmail.com</u>
- Bunnings is supporting this project and over the next few weeks Bunnings HO will notify us of the position within the Bunnings that they have arranged for each group to setup
- Your group representative will be sent contact details to make final arrangements
- ✓ Displays will be on Tuesday 25th & Wednesday 26th January

 \checkmark The Five 3m trees will be placed at the following Bunnings: o 1. Alexandria – Eastern Suburbs AG, Sydney Central AG • 2. Blacktown – Sydney North West AG • 3. Campbelltown – Macarthur AG • 4. Cross Roads – Sydney South West AG • 5. Kembla Grange – North Illawarra AG, South Illawarra AG • St George AG & Sutherland AG will not have 3m high trees, but they will be allocated a Bunnings (Kirrawee & another to be confirmed). An alternative style of display will be provided to these groups (large pullup banner)

 Clubs in each group are asked to arrange a roster of <u>Rotarians and friends for each location to sell the</u> <u>adoption of trees (25th & 26th January)</u>

✓ Either a manual roster via Excel or Google Docs can be used or an online free roster can be created at www.signupschedule.com

 People can adopt a tree and pay via a QR code or leave their email & mobile phone details on a registration sheet to be sent the link. They can also subscribe via the website or by leaving their details on a registration sheet
 No actual trees will be sold directly to the public, only adoptions

 District promotions will be made by social media, which can be shared by Clubs Arrange local promotion, including Club Websites, Club Facebook & Instagram pages, club brochures, printed signs in shop windows, local media promotions. ✓ Produce up-to-date information and contact details for your Club to use where appropriate ✓ Each group to arrange an appropriate planting day to plant the 200 saplings that will be used in their displays

 \checkmark Following Australia Day and throughout the year, showcase to your local community your involvement in growing your local community and future plans. This may be through local displays in shopping centres, markets, stories in newspapers, magazines and through schools, etc ✓ Each group of Rotary Clubs will be able to send information to the subscribers in their local group's postcodes via District. Individual Rotary Clubs will not be provided with contact details.

✓ Groups of Rotary Clubs are encouraged to plan a joint meeting in late March or April, before the plantings \checkmark Invite donors within their postcodes to promote the environment projects that they are participating in, or planning (postcodes will be grouped in AGs) ✓ Ongoing communication will be made with subscribers giving them regular updates on the growth of their trees, via photos, drone footage and videos

- Educational stories will be developed for schools, etc and Rotary Clubs can use this information to engage with their local communities
- ✓ Donations from this project will go towards "Rotary Smith Family Scholarships". The Smith Family will supply updates on their youth programs
- ✓ Smith Family Scholars may also be invited to attend Rotary Youth Programs

 The Five 3m high trees belong to our District and will be available for Rotary Clubs and AG groups to use in their future promotions (details to follow after Australia Day)
 This is an ongoing project and will grow and evolve, showcasing Rotary's commitment to the environment


