About Yes!

- ✓ Yes! Scholarships are for young people aged 12 to 17 years
- ✓ While annual Numbers are currently limited to 8, anyone who misses out may re-apply the next year.
- ✓ Yes! Scholarships are available for NSW: 4 for regional areas and 4 for metropolitan Sydney
- ✓ Yes! scholarships can be designed to suit the specific passion and needs of the recipient in the areas of:
 - Sports
 - Education (Sir Henry Yule Braddon Award) for example STEM subjects, computer studies
 - The Arts for example theatre, music and visual arts
 - The Environment
- ✓ Recipients will be awarded up to \$3,000 per year each

PCYC - Police Citizens Youth Clubs

Sir Henry Braddon was the founding President of Australia's first Rotary Club, the Rotary Club of Sydney, and set the agenda for youth support for the next century, and beyond. Sir Henry was committed to education and to youth. Sir Henry contributed to the founding of the Police Citizens Youth Club movement (PCYC) and the Northcott Society. He was an active advocate for elevating youth through sport, education, charities, government, politics and through community organisations such as Rotary.

What's Involved?

Rotary Districts and Clubs are invited to contact their local PCYC Club Manager to support and assist in coordinating the nominating of interested applicants. The process involves:

- 1. Identifying suitable applicants either from within or from outside the PCYC network
- 2. Complete a nomination form including:
 - a. Gaining support from parents/guardians
 - b. Identifying an area of passion or interest, and describing this in the nomination form
 - c. Compile information supporting the area of interest and passion
 - The local Rotary Club is encouraged to endorse nominees and submit applications to Rotary Club of Sydney
- 3. PCYC HQ will recommend awardees to the Rotary Club of Sydney for confirmation
- 4. Awardees will be communicated to all participating Rotary Clubs and PCYCs
- 5. Awardee's local Rotary Club is asked to announce winners at their weekly meeting and promote in their local press
- 6. All award winners will be celebrated on 20th April, 2021 at the Rotary Club of Sydney's lunch meeting
- 7. Awardees in each category will be announced at the annual NSW Police awards gala dinner held in November
- 8. Sponsorships to be actioned/completed within 12 months, unless an extension is requested and approved
