Governor Gavin Newsom—Mask Requirements Wednesday June 17, 2020

- Inside or waiting for public space
- Any health care setting
- Waiting or riding public transportation
- Walking in common areas (halls, stairs, elevators, parking lots)
- Physical distancing not possible with nonhousehold members
- Not applicable if under 12 years old, eating in restaurant, exercising outside with adequate physical distancing

Santa Clara County Public Health Officer "The Path Back" Effective June 5, 2020

- Outdoor dining at restaurants, food preparation/service facilities
- Retail/shopping centers for in-store shopping
- All manufacturing, warehousing, logistics
- House cleaning and other no-contact in-home services
- Low contact/no contact services including shoe/watch repair
- Pet grooming
- Childcare, summer school/camp/recreation in stable groups up to 12 children
- Religious/cultural/protest services, outdoors only, groups up to 25
- Outdoor recreation without physical contact, with social distancing (pools, golf, tennis, hiking, camping)
- Drive-in theaters and car-based gatherings





Santa Clara County Order of the Health Officer June 10, 2020

All Healthcare Facilities in the County must provide Diagnostic Testing to the following categories of patients of the Healthcare Facility who seek testing or other care, whether in-person or by phone or electronic message:

- 1. All Symptomatic Persons, as defined in Section 7, regardless of age, hospitalization status, comorbidities, or other risk factors for COVID-19;
- 2. All persons, with or without COVID-19 Symptoms, as defined in Section 7, who report that they have been exposed to a confirmed case of COVID-19; and
- 3. All persons, with or without COVID-19 Symptoms, who are at increased risk of exposure to COVID-19 by virtue of (1) working in High-Risk Settings, as defined in Section 7; (2) frequently or routinely traveling by mass transit; or (3) attending a mass gathering of 100 or more individuals in the 14 days prior to presenting for testing.

Testing must be provided at presentation

Payment may be sought from health plans or insurers, but not from patients if not covered


