



Member Contributions to Rotary Foundation and Polio Plus Campaigns

Los Gatos Rotary Board of Directors Motion Passed April 16, 2020

1. The Rotary Foundation contributions for 2019-2020 : all members who have not contributed will be billed \$25 through their credit card accounts. Those who have contributed at least that much for this period will not be billed.

2. The 2020 Polio Plus campaign: all members who contributed last year will be asked to give the same amount this year as they contributed last. All members who did not give last year, or who do not donate separately above \$25 this year, will be billed \$25 through their credit card accounts. If they do donate beyond that amount, they will not be billed the additional \$25.

3. All members will be given the option to "opt out" of either or both of these billings by contacting the Treasurer (Ed Bowen).

4. New members during this fiscal year who have been charged an initiation fee of \$200 (\$100 to the Club and \$100 to the Rotary International Foundation) will not be charged either of these fees. They still will be encouraged to contribute additional amounts.

Comments were invited and a few received

- No billings would occur until June
- All funds must be submitted before July 1 to Rotary International
- "Opt out" choice was made to allow any member to choose not to contribute, but to also facilitate collection of contributions
- No \$25 charge to any member contributing individually that amount or more voluntarily
- BOD can shift to "Opt in", send out requests for contributions with credit card or other donation type check off, and try to follow up with non-responders
- Membership can also vote to support the current motion



"Shelter in Place" Extended to April 30, 2020

- Stay home
- Only go out for essential supplies, medications, medical care, exercise
- Maintain social distances outside of home
- Wear a mask-any mask!
- Symptoms of cough, sneezing, fever may warrant testing if available
- Symptoms of shortness of breath require ER visit
- Positive testing requires quarantine
- Clean shared surfaces
- Wash hands with soap (20 seconds)
- Avoid touching your mouth, nose, eyes

WHAT "FLATTENING THE CURVE" MEANS

The chart shows that without protective measures such as quarantines and social distancing, an epidemic could surpass the healthcare system's capacity to care for patients. With protective measures, the hump or curve is flattened, allowing the healthcare system to handle the epidemic.








Data last updated April 26, 2020

Projection Deaths in California Peaking April 19






