


"Shelter in Place" Extended to April 30, 2020

- Stay home
- Only go out for essential supplies, medications, medical care, exercise
- Maintain social distances outside of home
- Wear a mask-any mask!
- Symptoms of cough, sneezing, fever may warrant testing if available
- Symptoms of shortness of breath require ER visit
- Positive testing requires quarantine
- Clean shared surfaces
- Wash hands with soap (20 seconds)
- Avoid touching your mouth, nose, eyes

WHAT "FLATTENING THE CURVE" MEANS

The chart shows that without protective measures such as quarantines and social distancing, an epidemic could surpass the healthcare system's capacity to care for patients. With protective measures, the hump or curve is flattened, allowing the healthcare system to handle the epidemic.





Total Deaths




These data are a snapshot of the capacity of all hospitals reporting data in Santa Clara County. Because of the normal fluctuation in the number of patients seen and cared for in hospitals, it's not uncommon for these data to vary day-to-day. Sometimes hospitals do not report daily updates. In those cases we use data from the previous day for non-reporting hospitals.

Note: COVID-19 patients includes confirmed and suspected cases. Available beds are beds that hospitals are licensed to use and surge beds are unlicensed beds that the facility can use. Currently hospitalized COVID-19 patients includes patients in levels of care other than ICU and acute hospital beds.


