PRESIDENTS REPORT - Jenny Selway

President's Annual Report (given at Changeover 16/7/23)

At the start of the year, my aim was "to have a year of fun, good projects and engagement from members. And plan a few changes – such as running with an executive board.

I wanted to focus on caring for our current members, and to encourage them to engage in projects, rather than the board deciding what we were doing.

- I hoped to promote the club in the media and
- I wanted members to have a great year.

And I am pleased to say that we have had a successful year full of giving and service as well as fellowship and fun along the way.

We have been involved in the Community in many ways- as I run through the projects, I will name the project leader (as a way of extending my thanks) – but bear in mind many members were involved in each project.

In November last year the whole club pitched in to run a **High Tea**, with a focus on connecting with the local community – and many of this year's achievements have been with local organisations that were present on that day.

Organised by Gerry and Ann was a massive Christmas activity- **Wishing Tree gift giving**. Providing children of all ages with gifts / gift cards – collaborating with local businesses and then distributing gifts through Anchor and The Yarra Ranges Community Policing Unit. This project was well publicised in the local paper, district newsletter and on social media. It was the second year we have run the project and we hope that it will happen this Christmas too.

Cheryl collaborated with **I Dare U** (a disabilities organisation) to assist with their inaugural fun run around **Lilydale Lake** – an all-abilities event with a focus on people with special needs

Ian coordinated us to assist **LTAG** – the Lilydale town action group in making and displaying Christmas decorations for the town

We supported the **Montrose FIDA (Football Integration Development Association)** clinic for people with an Intellectual Disability – with Andrew attending several clinics and then him and me on the presentation day.

Cheryl rostered us all onto **Gift wrapping** at the Lilydale Marketplace. It was a great way to interact with local people, spread Christmas cheer and promote the club

We have supported our new member Liz Millman to begin investigating and setting up a **Hills Rotary Satellite Club** – there are many hurdles to overcome but she will continue her endeavours into the next year.

Under Madalyn's organisation we are soon to assist **CIRE** with their First Impressions Clothing Exchange High Tea running later this month.

The **Maroondah Hospital IPU unit Care** bag project has begun with Barb Lawrence and Cheryl Mackay organising the first delivery of 200 bags to the hospital in July. The project is multi district – with different clubs managing different health care facilities. This project will continue on in the new Rotary Year. This has also been highlighted in the Star Mail newspaper.

Holy Fools has been supported and members and Interactors joined in a lunch with the Street Angels, as well as donating money and 10 shelter bags to the group – another example of community, interact and multi club activity.

Barb Lawrence rostered us to assist the Lilydale RSL with their **Dawn Service Gunfire breakfast**. And we have already been asked back for next year.

And Stef has made arrangements for us to join forces with an organisation called **123Read2Me** to recycle children's books and redistribute them to children in the Yarra Ranges area.

YOUTH We have also been involved in many **Youth** activities and programs.

Under the guidance of Ann Wheeler, we have a very active and energised **Interact club at Lilydale Heights College** – several members have been to their meetings and **Harmony Day**. Interactors assisted at the Street Angels Lunch, and some of their members attended **MUNA** this year.

Also organised by Ann Wheeler, Our **Primary School Speech Contest** had five local schools attending and the children and parents gave wonderful feedback re the value of the experience.

Richard and I hosted **Riley Williamson** – a young person from Portland, whilst he did a week's work experience in Lilydale – this was a cross District (9850) activity.

We have donated money to several schools at their speech nights – for service awards, and members attended the presentation evenings.

INTERNATIONALLY we have been part of several Rotary programs as well as our own projects Patrick assisted the club to obtain a Foundation grant which enabled us to provide home stay, transport and living costs to a young Timorese woman (Nuncia) – while she attended a 3-month English Language Course at **RMIT** English worldwide program. The Selway's, Parlet's and Mackay families hosted her for a month each. This is the second person we have sponsored for this program and is of great value on an individual as well as country level.

RORPS (Rotary Overseas Relocation of playgrounds) Des Shiel and others assisted in the demolishing of local playgrounds for the RORPS project – which collects and relocate playgrounds overseas, Des is an active member in DIK Inc, and we support DIK financially, as well as with donations – both to the warehouse and from the warehouse.

As a club we have made donations to **Foundation** and the **DG Family project, End Polio, RAM, W4K, ARH**. Led by Tim - We have supported **ROMAC** through the sale of crates and books are now offered at the Markets. We also donated to **Children First Foundation** and the **CIRE Step Up program**.

FUNDRAISING Our main fundraising **"The Lilydale Craft and Produce market"** has continued to run each month, making over \$26,800 this year. Thank you to **all** our members who regularly turn out to assist on the day, and Ann Wheeler and Des Shiel for all their hard work planning and running it each month.

We have moved our website to the Club Runner platform – this has allowed us to have a much more modern look to our webpage, and the club to centralise its records and information. Thank you to our local business sponsors who have funded the costs for the next three years.

We "Cashed" in our incentive points with district 9810 incentive program – receiving new Hoodies for all members, as well as caps and mugs/pens for use by the club. We also issued new T-shirts to members with updated logos and style. (Thank you Fully Promoted)

FELLOWSHIP

We have had many fellowship events throughout the year – movies, theatre, dinners, Pizza night Bowling and Bowls, Xmas breakups to name just a few of them. Each one was planned by a different member—leading to a variety of events and ideas.

WELCOMES

This year we have welcomed two new members – Barb Lawrence and Liz Millman. Both women have been very active in the club – and are already leading projects. Thank you to them and their mentors for such a great first year as members.

FAREWELLS – like all clubs we are farewelling members too.

Sadly, Bryan McCarthy passed away in November last year, and his loss to the club is very large. We remember him often and enjoy catching up with Maria on occasion.

Helen McDonald is farewelling us after 18 years. She was president in 2013 and also spent several years on the board as our secretary. Helen hopes to remain in contact with the club as her health allows.

Ian Darvell is hanging up his Rotary Shirt after 25 years in the club. He too was President in 2002 and has held almost every role available as a member. We hope that he and Helen will still be a part of Lilydale Rotary. Bill Parlet will retire after joining the club in 2014 and being our president in 2017, we are sure he will still be part of our club as his wife Madalyn remains a member.

Diane Fairley and Rod Busst also be left the club and we thank them for the service they gave as members. They will be welcomed back if they would ever like to re-join us.

And sadly we have been informed of the recent passing of Chris Hoskin, just last week (July '23). Chris was a member of our club from 2018, and the president in 2021. We send our deepest sympathy to his wife, Trish at this very hard time.

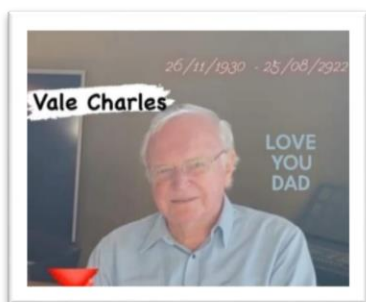

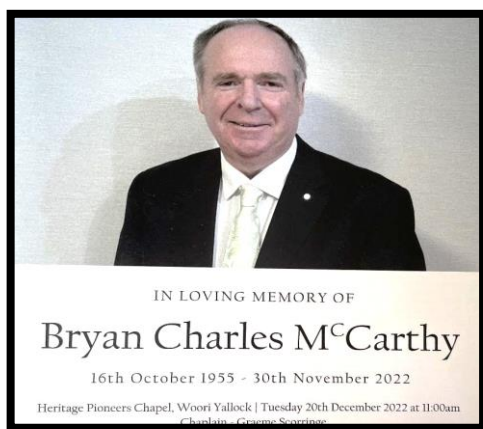

Eulogy

Bryan was a well-respected and active member of Rotary International. He joined Rotary Club of Chirnside Park in 2008 and later transferred to Rotary Club of Lilydale in 2014.

Bryan served as president in 2011/12, 2012/13 and at Lilydale in 2015/16. He led the Lilydale Club into its 50th year anniversary and all the celebrations that involved, including a gala dinner and production of a 50 years of Rotary Lilydale book.

In 2013 He was presented with A Paul Harris Fellow – an award recognizing his exemplary work in community service.

He and Maria were truly dedicated and involved in Youth Exchange – they have hosted several international students – Julia, Andrea, Tom and Laura – and have continued to maintain their relationships with them to this day. Bryan was very proud of his exchange family.

Bryan served in both clubs with an “all in and can do” approach. As well as being the President of the clubs three times, he was also at every market, fundraising activity or the humble sausage sizzle. One of Bryan’s last roles was that of working traffic control at the market each month –he loved to have a great discussion about world events or climate change whilst directing cars - sometimes this multitasking made for car park confusion, working alongside Bryan was never boring!

Bryan appears to have had a secret passion for dressing up in costumes and there are many stories of him and Maria dressing up for District Conferences--- Photos of Bryan as a Thunderbird character or a raunchy surgeon with Maria a sexy patient - are hidden in the Rotary Archives.

Bryan was a big part of Rotary, and he gave it everything he had-from using his policy/ procedure writing skills, {wrote the *LCPM manual*} applying for grants, to mentoring newer members or just making everyone feel welcome and important, we say Thank you for your contribution and you have left big shoes to fill – you will always be part of our clubs’ histories.

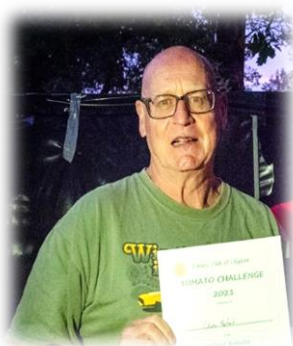

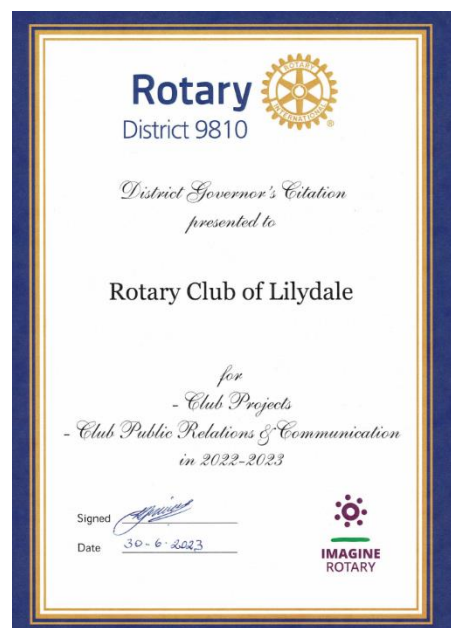

Supporting the environment is a new area of focus for Rotary since 1 July 2021 with access to global grants. It was our own Past RI President Ian H.S. Riseley, who as chair of the International Environmental Issues task force, championed its introduction. Immediately the Rotary Club of Lilydale enthusiastically created an Environment sub-committee for the 2021-2022 year. Since then, RCL has conducted various projects reflecting smart and efficient ways of protecting our environment.

This year we have supported recycling efforts through the delivery of goods to Donations In Kind and the recovery of playgrounds through RORPS. We have also conducted twelve weeding sessions to support Friends of Olinda Creek. There has been one new project led by Stef Kruger, **123Read2Me** that recycles children's books. We also delivered a total of 50 lap rugs to Wheelchairs for Kids in Perth. The rugs are made from recycled and new fabrics and yarns. Those visits to the factory afforded a good opportunity to the tour the site which is very impressive.

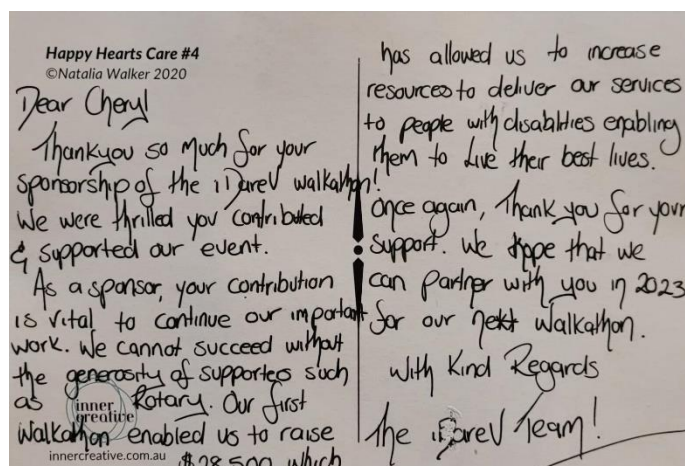

PROJECT:- IPU CARE PACKS

Outer Eastern Health Adult Mental Health Inpatient Service Care Pack Project.

RCL is proud to undertake a Care Pack project, providing approximately 1500 inpatient admissions to Maroondah Inpatient Units (IPU) located at Maroondah Hospital, with a bag of approved items to provide care and comfort. The IPU provide care and support to people aged 18-64 who require inpatient services for the treatment of mental health issues.

Hospital stays can be lonely and create anxiety, undoubtedly more so for mental health patients, so these bags are designed to assist in their rehabilitation (journals, activity books, stress balls etc) and to provide some comfort (hand moisturiser and lip balms). Our public health system does not have the budget to provide these items to patients.

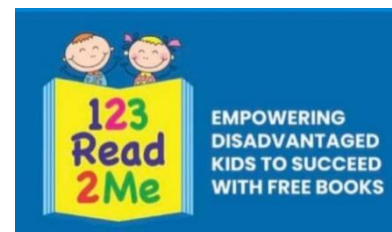

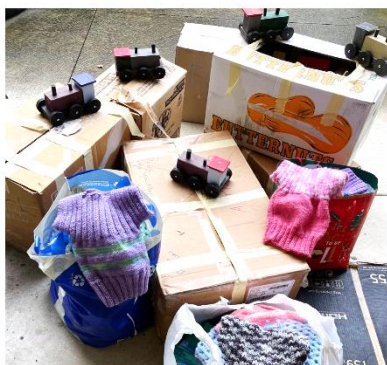
