Guest Speaker- Last Week

Jason Ward

It was great to welcome back Jason Ward, now GoldLinQ Communications and Stakeholder Director as our Guest Speaker.

Jason provided an update on the Gold Coast Light Rail – Glink which now has a network of 16 stations and is serviced by 14 trams with 10 in service at any given time. It was interesting to hear of the 'spare' tram positioned at the Gold Coast University Hospital Station that can be brought into service should there be delays across the system.

It was also interesting to hear that on the Open Day on 20 July 2014 an estimated 80,000 passengers enjoyed utilising the Trams across the day, without any incidents with some minor delays because of the passenger volumes.

Currently there are some issues including tram/wheel noise and the operators are looking at preventative measures that do not affect the traction and safe operation of the trams. Road rules associated with the trams are gradually improving and the staff are now dealing with customers and real time situations that are not able to be duplicated in training. Trespassing on the tram bridges and anti-social behaviour by passengers particularly over the weekend are other issues currently being addressed.

Since the trams came into operation in July 2014 there have been 5 million trips which equals the population of Queensland having ridden the trams over a nine month period. There is an average of 17,800 passengers per day or over 540,000 trips per month and the system has resulted in excess of a 22% increase in public transport.

It was good to hear the update on the Glink and the success of the system to date. Jason reminded us that we should all have a go card to enable the easy use of the system.
