

PPE Donation Disease Prevention and Treatment


The Rotary Club of Grenada through the kind donation from the Rotary Club of Burnaby BC has donated a total of over 3,000 items in personal protective equipment (PPE) to the Ministry of Health. The presentation took place on Tuesday, November 02, 2021. Items donated include 450 disposal isolation gowns, 1440 N95 disposable masks, 200 medical face shields and several other PPE items. In recognising the risks and challenges faced by medical practitioners on the front line, the President of the Rotary Club of Grenada, Alphonsus Daniel, expressed the club's commitment to actively support Grenadians during this pandemic.

STICRIS, a shelter for abused women, started as a pilot in 1985, financed by Dutch, American and Flemish organizations. After the shelter burnt down in 2011, STICRIS immediately planned to rebuild the home. Together with Quota Suriname, STICRIS got donations of considerable amounts from IAM GOLD, Apache Oil, and other companies. Rotary Quota additionally keeps funds available. In 2020, STICRIS opened a new shelter with 14 rooms. Professionals train the resident women into becoming economically & emotionally resilient. J Virtual Storytelling Basic Education & Literacy

RC SOUTHWEST TOBAGO

The virtual storytelling competition aimed to provide students aged 9-12 with an opportunity to share their COVID Experience. The project's overarching objective was to enhance students' communication, creativity, and literacy skills. Students were invited to make five-minute presentations on Water Conservation, Online school experience, cyberbullying or vaccination/COVID precaution. Aalaiyah Skye-Cupid, Bethany Sykes and Alike Cunningham placed first, second and third place and received cash prizes of \$1000, \$500 and \$300 respectively. Aalaiyah Skye-Cupid also won the People's Choice component which was decided by via likes and engagement on Facebook. Each student also received school supplies and Haagen Dazs gift certificates.




Even when the world was so severely restricted by the impact of COVID-19, these grants continued, in addition to delivering around US \$870,000 in district grants. In 2021, Rotary wants to raise US \$50 million for PolioPlus, which will be matched 2-to-1 by the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation, for a total of \$150 million. If every Rotary club contributed just US \$1,500, we would surpass this goal.
