## **Hiroichi Nago**

Hiroichi Nago, President of EM Hawaii, LLC. Hiro's ancestral roots come from Gushikawa-Okinawa in Japan. His grandfather immigrated at a young age and moved his family to various islands and finally settled in Kula, Maui. Hiro came to Hawaii at age of 5 and grew up in an environment of naturally grown foods and this led Hiro to earn a bachelor's degree in horticulture from the University of Hawai'i at Mānoa.

Inspired by Prof. Teruo Higa, Hiro decided that promoting the benefits of EM® and getting away from the overuse of chemicals would be his life mission. He joined EM Research Organization as a researcher in 1995 and

Many schools and organizations have participated each year in this project.
