Mamey Primary school

This is a two room primary school. They need everything. Most young people left the community and the school has not been used for 15 years. Young people have returned and there are now 15 kindergarteners and first grades (confirm number). The community would like to reopen the school. Currently they are using two rooms in the hacienda

A three way government match is being explored. Some money from locals and their usa relatives is required. The match program requires a lot of paper work and will need someone locally to help with this. The building needs a new roof STRUCTURE as well as roofing, electrical, paint, white boards, chairs, fans, toilet building rehab, outside canopy, outside paving, and more.

Las Palmas Secondary school

This school has grown and is now 100 students (school year 2017-18). This is the secondary school that many of the Las Palmas primary students attend. These students receive an excellent beginning and good instruction with computers. Port Townsend Rotary is joining our grant to provide computers for the school.

The school is building a new classroom and will be completed by August. The Rotary volunteer grant account from the La Prepa project had some money from clubs and the remainder was given to the school so the classroom could be a computer ready room. This part did not work for hands-on.

Much has been accomplished at this school by parents and the administration. This is a large elementary school with a n active parent organization and many volunteers. Salamanca, the director of La Prepa, was parent club president here when his son was a student. They are in the process of rewiring the entire school and having enough electric capacity for air-conditioning. Their main need is to complete the painting of the exterior and for a library and computer room. Computer desks modeled on the La Prepa design will be part of the volunteer work.
