Participants





Costs

Total cost estimated to approximately 122 000 SEK.

Funding

- Part of the revenues from the Santa races 2022 and 2023 and from sale of Sven Andersson's photos were dedicated to the Baltic Sea Initiative we count on receiving a grant from this pot (the sum to be determined by the steering group).
- Grant from District Governor (promised 10 000 SEK)
- Grant from District Project Fund (application pending, 9600 SEK)
- Grant from Rotary Youth Exchange Jubileumsfond (application to be sent submitted in November 2023, 16 000 SEK)
- In kind sponsorship, e.g. from Linnaeus University
- Grant from the Foundation for collaboration Latvia-Sweden (application to be submitted in March 2024)
- We will apply for grants from Latvian sources (Rotary clubs, companies, organisations etc) and additional Swedish sources



Project schedule

- Fall 2023: Planning (activity plan, responsibilities etc), securing funding, contacting schools, contacting partners, designing the format and contents.
- Spring 2024: Selection of participants, continued work with bookings and program contents, detailed planning for transportation, accommodation etc, recruit volunteers for various chores, pre-camp activities online, PR.
- August 3-10, 2024: Summer camp.
- Autumn 2024: Post-camp activities online, summary and report.
