Public libraries now provide services, resources and technology that didn't exist when Pomfret Public Library was built! Lending books is still the stock-intrade, but there is a new emphasis on group learning experiences, creativity, and community events that necessitates meeting room spaces, equipment and furnishings.

...a little bit bigger, a little bit better!

The planned addition includes about 2000 sq. ft of meeting room space for groups of 8 to 60 people. This space will be available for programs and events sponsored by the library and by other community organizations.

Technology: fully equipped with computers, fiber internet, wifi, projection and sound

Pomfret Public Library has 1800 cardholders and about 10,000 visitors annually. In 2019 there were 186 programs attended by 2100 people, and a circulation of 16,400 items. The library's collection has over 20,000 books and DVDs, and hundreds of thousands more available online.



There are 3 public computer stations and an additional 8 laptops available on request, copy/print/fax, and fiber internet with wifi.

The library is open 32 hours/week, every week of the year.
