Guest speaker – Lesley McCarthy

Topic: Environment and Sustainability Rotary Action Group (ESRAG) Oceania – what can Rotarians do?

Lesley is a Past President of the Rotary Club of Flemington Kensington and has held many roles within the club over the last 17 years.

She has served as an Assistant Governor, is former editor of the District 9800 newsletter, and is a current Rotary Leadership Institute facilitator. She is on the executive of ESRAG Oceania and District 9800 Environment & Sustainability committee.

Lesley opened her presentation by explaining that ESRAG has a goal to have an active committee in every district and a representative in every club in Rotary's Zone 8 (Oceania). The web site is filled with resources to help clubs implement their projects https://esragoceania.org/

ESRAG's primary objective is to educate and inform clubs in six focus areas of biodiversity, circular economy, climate, food systems, pollution (e.g. plastics) and sustainable living.

Lesley had a well-prepared presentation which has been circulated to members. It was informative and was easily followed. Her call to action was, "No one can do everything, but everyone can do something" to improve our environment.
