Mawien Ariik (known as Ariik) was born in 1989 in the village of Lou Ariik, South Sudan. At the age of 8, he learned that his father (Ariik Dut) had died in the South Sudan war along with millions of others while fighting for the freedom of his people.

This sad loss became Ariik's motivation to continue the legacy of freedom that his father fought for, and to ensure those efforts were not in vain. Ariik created South Sudan Health Matters Inc as a platform for identifying the basic needs of the village and surrounding parts of South Sudan. Needs such as basic healthcare, education, clean water, sanitation, and hygiene. Ariik is married with two children and works in the banking sector.

Chairman Russell Rolls then introduced Dr Niamatullah Ibrahimi who spoke brilliantly on the topic: "**Navigating**

the Human Rights and Humanitarian Crises under the Taliban in Afghanistan".

Dr Ibrahimi was born in Afghanistan and from 2002-2005 worked for the International Crisis Group followed by 5 years with the Crisis States Research Centre of the London School of Economics. He is the author of "The Hazards and the Afghanistan State: Rebellion, Exclusion and Struggle for Recognition". He is also a Lecturer in International Relations at La Trobe University.

After the West's massive investment of military intervention and economic intervention in an attempt to establish security and a more liberal society in Afghanistan the withdrawal in August 2021 has seen life under the Taliban spiral into human rights, humanitarian and economic crises.

While the world's attention has been diverted to the Ukraine the situation in Afghanistan has seriously deteriorated. Covid, drought, and the withdrawal of the Western finance and presence have resulted in 97% of the population living in poverty and, often, near starvation. This is the worst material crisis in the world with the possible exception of Ukraine. The International community has almost no avenues open to assist the struggling population of 40 million.

In addition, there is a human rights crisis. After initial optimism on the part of the West, the Taliban have slipped back into extreme policies, issuing a series of decrees pushing women out of society and attempting to "cleanse" the nation of Western influence. Open media, protests, and discussion in all forms has been strongly suppressed. Journalists have been arrested and tortured while many others have left the country. The promised amnesty has been forgotten and mass killings have occurred.

The Taliban is now faced with an even more radical and violent Islamic State group, The Khorasan adding further chaos and instability.

With the Taliban's loyalties focussed entirely on national and surrounding regions, there is little influence that the international community can bring to bear in order to improve this complex, deteriorating situation. It will take a long-term approach, with human rights and long-term stability essential as the focus of international policies.

You can also find out more about The Lighthouse project. In South Sudan's remote Lou Ariik Village, it is a common experience for girls to miss school during menstruation and, because of poor sanitation and hygiene, infection rates are higher than they should be. Most schools are also 'under the trees' schools.

This project will distribute 800 re-usable menstrual hygiene kits with a carefully designed education program. The principal intended outcome is to improve girls' school retention and educational performance. In broader terms, the project is designed to empower girls, address traditional cultural mores sensitively, and reduce infection rates. Your contribution is going to a great cause!
