Dwight Leeper gave a talk and showed a video about polio eradication. Polio is not yet defeated. The World Health Organization was established in 1988 when there were 350,000 new cases. There are currently 74 cases.

In August, Africa was declared polio free. COVID is now providing problems since Pakistan cannot vaccinate.
