# SPEAKERS REVIEW by Danielle Mortimer

Last Thursday, we had the pleasure of hearing **Nick Branton's** Classification Talk.

Nick was born in Delaware County and raised in the town of Exton. He loves the area and couldn't ask for a better place to live. While attending Bishop Shanahan High School, Nick was very active in sports. After participating in baseball and basketball, he realized that he liked contact sports the best – it provided him with an outlet for stress and anger! He excelled in football – his accomplishments include the winning touchdown for the 1<sup>st</sup> ChesMont league victory, being the 1<sup>st</sup> recipient of "Player of the Week", and holding the single game rushing record. Nick forged friendships in his school years that continue to this day – even though this core group of friends have spread out over the country, they still visit with each other when they can.

Out of high school, Nick attended Hofstra University in New York, drawn in by the facts that it was 30 minutes from Manhattan and 10 minutes from the beach. After realizing that the school was too expensive, he came back to his roots and attended West Chester University and Delaware County Community College. Of the three schools that he attended, he found that DCCC had the most dedicated professors who were there not for the money, but to educate and nurture their students. He highly recommends that anyone considering a college education to begin with community college.

Nick opted for life experience over college and

has traveled to both France and Italy and has hiked the Appalachian Trail without a map! He has held a variety of jobs including bartending, construction, and landscaping. The experience of a lifetime awaited him when a friend recommended a career in maritime, which led him to getting his boating license and taking a job in Florida as an engineering assistant on a day's notice! While he enjoyed doing this, a wise man advised him that this is not the career for him if having a family is something that he wanted in his future. Being away for 90% of the time wasn't appealing to Nick so he had to decide what he wanted to do.

Through a connection with one of his friends, Nick was able to interview with Swope Lees Commercial Real Estate. During the interview, he was asked if he could survive at least 3-4 years without a living wage. When he agreed that he could, he was advised to get his real estate license and then come back. He did just that and now has been working for Swope Lees for 4 years now and he couldn't be any happier with this decision to go into commercial real estate.

## SCHOLARSHIP AWARDED

Brian Andiario, a senior at East High School, an Eagle Scout, a school and community volunteer, is the recipient of a 2019 Rotary scholarship. The \$2,000 scholarship was awarded to Brian at a recent luncheon meeting by club president-elect, **Matt Holliday**, as Brian's parents and Rotarians looked on.

Brian says his community involvement made him an all-around better person, more aware, caring. understanding, vocal and outgoing. Among his volunteer activities, he organized a food drive for the St. Agnes Day Room, to address some of the needs of that community. He coordinated the advertising. loaistics and communication with St. Agnes to prepare for the schoolwide event, resulting in the collection of enough food to feed hundreds of families. A member of Students Against Destructive Decisions (SADD), he reached out to fellow students asking their support against drunk driving, suicide, and other destructive behaviors. His Eagle Scout project further involved him in helping his community. He refurbished a wooden train at the Goshen Friends School playground, which was a favorite of the students, but had deteriorated and become a danger to the children. This project involved planning and coordination with suppliers, volunteers and the school.

His high school and community volunteering and leadership made Brian a prime candidate for the scholarship, which he will use when he attends Penn State University. Brian is the son of Bill and Karen Andiario.
