Induction of Anne and Joe Driscoll and Jeff Richards by Sue Casso Rogers

Sue has a book of Rotary Wisdom - "Why I am a Rotarian". One essay mentioned friendships, changing lives including his own, and making him a better person. Inducted today were: **Anne Driscoll** (Sponsor- **Sue Casso Rogers** and Mentor **Christine Scott**), **Joe Driscoll** (Sponsor **Bob Rogers** and Mentor **Phil McFadden**), **Jeff Richards** (Sponsor Chris Franz and mentor **Glen Sweet**). They are charged with the responsibility of being a Rotarian. Their donations to Rotary-sponsored programs will be used to do good things around the world.

Classification Talk by Meg Lynch Van Riet

Sue Flynn suggested Meg join our club. Meg grew up in several places but mostly in Europe. She worked in London, Brussels, and Netherlands but then attended graduate school in Philly. When she was growing up, her family lived in Hong Kong for several years. She showed photos of a trip to Europe that included her daughter Kate overlooking the scene of where Meg took a ferry and two trams to school every day in Geneva. Since Meg didn't speak any French, she appreciates those who can't speak the language of the locals. Her school was very diverse and gave her a great outlook on life. Meg loves art and architecture and believes she has been in every church in Europe! Meg is interested in food and speaks many languages.

Meg went to Kenyon for her undergraduate work and majored in languages- Medieval French, Modern French, Mandarin and German. Her second major was in Studio Arts. After graduation she worked at Morningstar in Chicago and then in London. Desiring to be more practical, she got her degree at Wharton Graduate School in Finance. On the side she ran a crisis hot line for women. She worked at ING and then Bain and Co in Boston and reported for board of directors.

She married a Dutchman who will remain nameless and had children. Wanting to return to the US to be near family, her children are now 14 and 15 year olds who go to Rustin. Somewhere in this story she got a divorce. Her sister lives in Ambler. Married in 2010, her sister was diagnosed with brain cancer in 2011, lost her hearing, and was in the hospital for one year. She is doing well now but this experience changed her whole family's life. Indeed, it caused Meg to examine her life and concluded that these were her values: Family, faith, purpose. She now teaches yoga at her studio Bikram Yoga Chadds Ford (across from Jimmy Johns). She has had 300 regular students and has served 6,000 total. Most classes are "hot" yoga at 105 degrees. It's her form of service. Meg works for the Bill and Janey Lasko Foundation where, among other things, they help low-income youth with various programs including after school programs.

In a nutshell, Meg loves to hang out with kids, do yoga, and be outdoors.
