Today, **Yolanda Van de Krol** introduced our guest speakers from Grandfamilies, Deborah Willet and Kathryn Spurlock. As children of incarcerated parents, they started the program at Chester County Prison to promote family cohesiveness and stability in the lives of our county youth.

Grandfamilies was formed out of a need to support children who suffered trauma in their lives, substance abuse issues in the home, mental health concerns, and incarcerated parents unable to care for their children.

Deb has worked with Grandfamilies for 11 years and explained how the organization works collaboratively with other community agencies to meet the needs of their clients.

Grandfamilies consists of households headed by Grandparents, relatives (aunts, uncles, cousins, siblings, step-parents), and non relatives. There are 2 categories of families within the program-informal which require little or no support, and formal which often receive extra supportive services from Children, Youth and Families.

For all backgrounds, 4.9% of children live in 1 of these family categories and 20% live in poverty. There are many multicultural families and this program does save money for the federal foster care system saving an estimated 4 billion annually since inception.

With the implementation of this program, children can become independently functioning members of our community. Children in these situations often feel different from other children, and this program aims at providing children with the proper biological and emotional support to promote stability and success in their lives. These grandparents often feel isolation since they have young children, and concerns about what will happen to their children if something happens to them. Often retirements plans are put on hold, and with the added COVID concerns, they are in a higher risk category due to their age and health conditions. Grandparents often need support with legal, medical, financial and emotional issues. That is where Grandfamilies can help!
