## **SPEAKERS REVIEW by Kyle Rheiner**

On the 28th, we had the pleasure to hear about Rotoplast International from Mark and Mary Ellen.

For those who aren't familiar, Rotoplast International is a 501 (c) (3) that is committed to helping children and families worldwide by eliminating the burden of cleft lip and/or palate, burn scarring and other deformities.

Mark only joined rotary 15 months ago and Mary Ellen retired customer service executive and seeing where these kids live and grow up has changed her life and mindset, as Rotary does for so many of us.

Mark shared his story and photos of his trek to Monrovia, Liberia from August of 2018 where 20 Rotarians banded together to assist the folks at the St. Joseph's Catholic Hospital where they provided free surgeries to children and adults. After the surgeries, the smiles of the patients were contagious! Very moving!

Mary Ellen started out with: "Births don't always go right." And she knows firsthand as her brother had meningitis when he was born and her family was

quarantined and made to feel like an outcast when she was only 5 years old.

The mantra of Rotoplast is "Saving Smiles, Changing Lives."

That said, those with a cleft lip or palate are judged immediately by those that see them. We learned today that the lip/mouth area is one of the last areas to form, and sometimes it just doesn't complete the formation. It's more of a case of bad luck and bad timing. If a child needs a surgery for a cleft lip AND palate - they do lip the first and the palate a year later. Having a cleft lip/palate can lead to difficulty in speaking, eating and promote ear infections.

19,000+ individuals have been helped by Rotary/Rotoplast since 1992 - Anyone can get involved and contact Mark to hear about future missions.

We then presented Mark and Mary Ellen with a check for \$1,000 to which they were very grateful.



**SOUP FOR SAFE HARBOR** 

This year's Soup Project will be a little different. We are asking that all Rotarians make the same soup (recipe below) and freeze in gallon Ziploc bags. We will be collecting the soup at our meeting on April 4<sup>th</sup> and delivering it to Safe Harbor.

# **Ingredients**

- 1 lb lean ground beef
- 1 small onion, finely diced
- 2 cloves garlic, minced or pressed
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 2 cups peeled and chopped potatoes
- 2 cans (14.5 oz each) beef broth
- 1 can (10 oz) condensed tomato soup
- 1 can (15 oz) petite diced tomatoes, undrained
- 1 bag (16 oz) frozen mixed vegetables
- 1 teaspoon Worcestershire sauce
- 1 teaspoon dried parsley
- 1/2 teaspoon dried basil
- salt & pepper, to taste

# Instructions

In a soup pot, over medium-high heat, brown the ground beef, onion, garlic, and salt until no longer pink. Break up meat in crumbles as it cooks. Drain and return to the soup pot.

- Add chopped potatoes, beef broth, tomato soup, diced tomatoes, frozen vegetables, Worcestershire sauce, and the seasonings. Stir to combine. Bring to a boil. Once boiling, cover with a lid and reduce hear to medium-low. Let simmer for at least 30 minutes for the flavors to combine and the soup to become thicker.
- Put into freezer Ziploc bags. Lay flat on cookie sheet and freeze.
