SPEAKERS REVIEW by Kyle Rheiner

On Thursday, Nov. 14th, we had the opportunity to listen to Tamara Wilson and Taylor Moots inform us about their Non-Profit. CASA Youth Advocates. Inc.

CASA is an acronym for Court Appointed Special Advocates and their role in our community is to be the "Eyes and Ears of the Court." First beginning in 1970 by a doctor in Seattle WA, their goal was "to help abused and neglected children live well, achieve academic excellence, and experience the joys of childhood by providing them with trained volunteer Advocates who speak for their best interests."

There are now over 1,000 programs in the US and 20 in PA. The Delco office was their first in PA in 1992. They now have a new office in West Chester and as of 2018, they're serving 48 children in 36 cases, utilizing 28 Volunteers. They believe that every abused and neglected child has the right to grow up in a safe, stable, and nurturing home environment with healthy family connections. CASA kids are more likely to be adopted, half as likely to enter back into the welfare system, and the cases in Chester County close within 18 months, which is incredibly fast!

They're the 2018 GlaxoSmithKline Impact Award

Winner and have a number of fundraising events annually, including their Annual Superhero 5k, and their exciting Gala - which is December 6, 2019, 6:00 PM-10:00 PM Drexelbrook Catering & Special Event Center, Drexel Hill, PA. Open Bar, Dinner, Awards, Silent Auction

They're always looking for volunteers, which they put through a rigorous, and necessary training and screening process. Their goal is to have the volunteers and children in a one-to-one ratio for 12 months at a time (but many volunteer an average 46 months!). The stability of a friend for these children is a must, as they're used to a number of people and homes changing constantly for them. 10-15 hours is the typical monthly commitment.
