## SPEAKERS REVIEW by Pat Barron

The State of the Club Address by Sue Casso-Rogers

The president's annual State of the Union Address pales in comparison to the thrilling and fact-filled address by the hard-working Sue Casso-Rogers' "State of the Club Address". I could hardly record my notes to preserve this address for posterity, because my hand was shaking with excitement...well, maybe I had too much coffee...same thing, right? This was a session devoted to discussing club business and Sue **DID** deliver a fact-filled and insightful talk on how our club is doing. Cut to the punch line...it is doing great!

It was obvious that Sue had devoted a lot of time to dissecting our club's membership profile in ways that are meaningful. (If you wish to see all the numbers, I'm sure that Sue would be happy to send you her really very excellent PowerPoint presentation.) Below are some facts and figures about our club, some of which may surprise you.

Our club consists of approximately two-thirds males and one-third females. The average age is 59. We have 30 members under the age of 30; 46 between the ages of 30 and 50; and 53 over the age of 50. The average number of years as members of our club is thirteen, which actually makes us a "newer" club. Fifty-nine percent of our members attend our Thursday meeting or submit a qualifying make-up. Almost twelve percent of our members never attend our Thursday meeting, but that is fine. Most live out of town and take pride in retaining membership in our club. Two-thirds of our members attend over half of our meetings, so we are an "engaged" group. Thirty percent of our members are retired; sixteen percent are engaged in financial services; twenty-five percent are business owners; and eight percent work for nonprofits. The rest (twenty-one percent) are lawyers, realtors, or work in government, religion, or education. So we have a nice, diverse set of skills among club members.

Ours is the largest club in the district by far, even though we do not have a formal recruitment program. We do lose members occasionally, but never because they lose interest in the club. They move, change jobs, etc. However, there are some classifications and major employers who are not represented in our club--West Chester University, Chester County Hospital, A Duie Pyle, CTDI, Krapf Buses, West Chester Area School District (except for Superintendent Jim Scanlon), and restaurants and retail. So, there is a recruiting opportunity there.

Thanks, Sue, for giving us such a great "State-of-the-Club Address".
