Rosedale and High. At the center of campus is largest building housing their Bio-engineering program as well as Nursing, Physics, etc. About 7 WCU graduates were in the room.

1871 Normal School 130 students and 30 youngsters in model school. Music and Fitness were emphasized. Early on had sports teams for men and women.

1926 Turned over to the state- George Morsi Phillips. Grandfather clock owned by Benjamin Franklin and Peale portrait of George Washington. 1,300 students. State Teachers College No tuition before 1928 (had to teach in PA for 2 years after graduation.

1934- Goat was mascot, 1935 changed to Ram. 1939- 4-year degree instituted.

1945- First time for black females to live on campus.

1960- Changed from State Teachers College to State College. Majors: Music Phys Ed and Elementary ed. 2,600 students.

1970s added Nursing and Criminal Justice.

1980 8,800 students.

1983 – Became WCU. 25% are first generation college students.

Madeline Adler- First female president.

Now have satellite offices.
