## SPEAKERS REVIEW by Patty Roos

The speaker was Kevin Thompson from Green Valley Inspections. The subject was "Stucco – The Good the Bad & the Ugly".

Green Valley Inspections has been providing high quality home inspection services for over 10 years. This area of the country has a lot of stucco issues because there is a much bigger inventory of stucco homes. Unfortunately, many were attached to wood frames and there are installation errors. There are two forms of stucco, lumpy and not lumpy. Problems usually fester for 5-10 years before it becomes known to the homeowner. A water-resistant barrier is crucial to keeping a stucco home drier. With stone and stucco, a wood frame does not allow for the water to run down and out, it is just absorbed into the wood and becomes moldy. Issues that lead to the deterioration of the house frame occur because there is no kick out flashing/no weather barrier, no weep screen or the sill pan flashing is missing.

There are three methods for inspections: 1) Visual, but that doesn't really show the damage underneath 2) Thermal Imaging, but that only shows a colorful picture, but not where the damage is and then 3) Moisture Probe Testing. Probe Testing puts small holes into the stucco (that can be easily mended) and it will pick up moisture content.

Why do we test stucco? You need to have your stucco tested because you can't see what is going on underneath the stucco. Chimney hips can also be an issue as are corners of the home.

The tighter we build houses these days, the bigger the problem because the water gets in and there is no air flow to dry the water out. As a firm, they have done over 900 homes a year and Kevin said 50% are a full house tear out. He also warns of contractors that will do the job "in patches" which cost more because it takes more time to work around sections than to just tear out and repair the entire side.
