#### SPEAKER'S REVIEW BY Faith Woodward

Kathy Mullin, representing the Red Cross, was introduced by **Doug Meis**.

As a volunteer with Red Cross for 4.5 years, Kathy has not been bored being retired from a major corporation for 40 years.

This fabulous organization is her passion and was recently reorganized. The region used to stretch to Scranton and Pottsville. When responding to disaster, that was just too far. Now called SEPA this branch covers Philadelphia, Bucks, Montgomery, Chester, and Delaware counties. Kathy's duties cover Montgomery, Chester, and Delaware counities.

Many people only know the Red Cross for the blood drives. Kathy is a Community Leader who informs the public about the Red Cross. She would like the Red Cross to join in Rotary programs to inform people.

Their Mission: to prevent and alleviate human suffering wherever it may be found. Its purpose is to protect life and health and to ensure respect for the human being. Their crew is 90% volunteer..

Last year, besides COVID, there were many weather disasters including wildfires in the west coast and the Derecho 100 mph winds in the Midwest. Signing up online, Kathy went out to Oregon to help. At that time shelters were not available, so they used hotel rooms. Those who were homeless took advantage of these

hotel accommodations. Volunteering every day from 7 AM to 6 PM, helped her to appreciate how good we have it here. One man lost his home and only had trash bags full of his belongings. The Red Cross offers short-term help and even helped with vaccination projects. For example, Afghan refugees need long-term help.

The Red Cross provided 1.2 million over-night stays. Ninety cents of every dollar is spent on care. Kathy says the rumors of CEOs getting all the money is not true.

Training is all on-line. Kathy is certified in feeding, preparedness, and training. Volunteers need to be ready to help for a 14-day period.

Preparedness help came through 15,000 new alarms installed, 5,900 homes made safer with fire escape plans, 7,000 students taught with the Pillowcase Project. (this program for 3rd, 4th and 5<sup>th</sup> grade talks about safety. In PA they talk about thunder and lighting, snowstorms, fires, and tornadoes. There is a workbook for each student. During Katrina people had to evacuate their homes and they tried to pack up their items, so the Pillowcase project instructed people to use pillowcase for personal items. At the program, each child gets a pillowcase to take home to keep for emergencies. The leaders talk about how to get out of each room in your house. Children are instructed to practice a fire drill with their parents.

The Red Cross partners with the Fire Department. They canvas neighborhoods with flyers to have home assessed for fire plans and safety. Kathy does the education piece and then fire men check smoke detectors that should be in every floor and in every bedroom and in kitchen.

In the summer there are not as many donors for the Blood Drive, so please sign up.

Military support- provide services to more than 2,800 service members. They can help to locate missing people and support families whose loved one is in the military.

The Red Cross offers babysitting class, CPR, First Aid, Swimming, Life guarding, and a CNA course. Please Google the red Cross to find services

Clara Barton started the organization in 1870 in the US after the Civil War.

They will work with corporations to get donations and would like to work with Rotary.
