#### **SPEAKERS REVIEW by Danielle Mortimer**

On Thursday, March 18<sup>th</sup>, we welcomed Jennifer Lopez and Emily McClure from the Friends Association for Care & Protection of Children. The Rotary Club of West Chester is proud to have supported this organization since 2007. In 1822, The Friends Association for Care & Protection of Children was founded in Philadelphia as an orphanage for city children by quaker women and the African American community. From 1915-2010, it served as a girl's home, adoption & foster care community and from 2010 to present day it has been responding to evolving needs within community and the mission became focused on family homelessness and housing instability.

The mission and vision of The Friends Association for Care & Protection of Children is to strengthen our community, prevent homelessness, promote the independence of families, and lead the community in eliminating homelessness for children and their families. Our speaker defined homelessness as a lack of a true home - a decent place that supports human dignity and development and provides stability and connects one to a larger community. The Friends Association's motto is to prevent homelessness, provide emergency shelter, partner with families for stabilization, and promote systemic change. We learned that in Pennsylvania, 42% of those unhoused are in families, 53% are individuals, 5% are solo youth. In Chester County in 2018, 185 families were on a waiting list for emergency shelter and 79 families provided emergency shelter.

The Friends Association for Care & Protection of Children model is a housing first approach which focuses on providing housing, a 2-generation approach which includes working with both children and adults, trauma informed practices which acknowledge the impact of the trauma, and resiliency focused practices which builds on strengths. The organization has recently implemented an Eviction Prevention Court in response to the pandemic. It provides an attorney and court coordinator, financial support, and social service supports to those who risk becoming evicted.

The Friends Association for Care & Protection of Children also has an event coming up on May 13<sup>th</sup> at 7PM, a conversation with Dr. Matthew Desmond, who is the author of Evicted. Tickets are free! We are so grateful for The Friends Association for Care & Protection of Children and thank both Jennifer and Emily for joining our meeting!
