He retired in 2016 after 41 years in several administrative and executive positions. His wife, Mary, and he retired to Downingtown to be near our two sons and three grandkids.

His Rotary career: a member of this club since March of 2017, but he's been a Rotarian since 1986. In 35 years in Rotary, he's been in 5 clubs, served on 3 different boards, countless committees, and became president once. His biggest honor was being named Rotarian of the Year in 2015, and he is a Paul Harris fellow +2.

President Steve says, "I take "Service above Self" seriously. It's more than just a slogan for me – it's why we're all here – to serve our community. I'm here for you. This club isn't about me – it's about you and the good work we do for our community. I won't waste your time – I don't believe in having meetings for meetings' sake, and when we're done with our business, we'll go home. I'll never ignore you – I'll try to answer every email. You'll know what's going on. I plan to regularly update you on major board meeting

happenings, district events, RI announcements, etc. If I miss something you're interested in or want to know about, please drop me an email. Finally, I think it's important to have fun. My personal mission for this upcoming year is a very simple, 3-part statement:

My mission is to return our club to pre-pandemic prominence, by re-energizing our club through: re-engaging our members; growing our membership; and widely telling our story...and have some fun in all things we do, in service, socially, and professionally.."

The new RI president is Shekhar Mehta, and his theme for the year is "Serve to Change Lives". His request of us is simple: let this be a year of changemakers and let's begin with our own membership. He urges all of us to think of new ways to reach out to our community to involve more and more people with Rotary.

And we have some terrific new leaders to help us do that, starting with three new board members – **Dave Wood, Phil Beig,** and **Doug Meis**. We've got some fantastic new committee chairs as well:

Past-President Michelle chair of the club's foundation, as well as the governance committee. John Schwab, chair of a new committee, the communications committee. We have a new program chair in Doug Meis. New member orientation is another critical effort for the coming year and will be handled by Sue Casso Rogers. Katie Martin is chair of the audit committee. Jeff Spencer is our new chair of the fellowship committee. Our new Chili-Cook Off chair is Bill Friedmann!

John Schwab and then President-Elect Steve were joined by then President Michelle and Sue Casso Rogers to outline the simplest of basic strategic plans. The plan maintains our three basic goal areas: making a difference; we are rotary; and telling the rotary story. Under each of these, through a few specific objectives, there are only twelve (12) specific action items. In addition to those, as has been our custom, a list of club-related objectives to achieve for a presidential citation have been identified. It's a very simple plan, reduced to only 4 pages, 3 major goal areas, and 12 action items, all focused one way or another on the membership with the overall thinking that we didn't want to bog the club down with a lot of goals and objectives when we're focused so critically on working to bring our club back.
