SPEAKER'S REVIEW BY Faith Woodward

Our speaker was Katie Walters, Coordinator of Safe and Healthy Communities Initiative from the Chester County DA's Office. She reported that the DA will be speaking to us on Sept 2 about child abuse prevention initiations.

COVID -19 has had negative impact on children and not only with schooling issues. Child abuse numbers were lower during this time because it wasn't reported.

The statistics are staggering for Child Sexual Abuse 850% increase since 2012. 1-10 children will be abused before age 18. They generally know their abusers, have a tendency to drop out of school and use drugs and alcohol.

Many children don't report abuse because they don't know that it is wrong and don't feel safe to report it. We all need to enforce open door policies and educate adults about prevention. A Chester County Child Abuse training program is offered for free. These courses include stories of survivors, how to recognize, prevent, and report sexual abuse.

Katie recounted one story about a local piano teacher who was abusing his students behind closed doors while parents were in the waiting room. After this teacher left, the owner of the school put cameras in the rooms to prevent future abuse. This is just one of many stories. We all must take an active role.

Chester County has a nationally recognized child abuse program. The goal of the initiative of the sexual abuse program is prevention. Katie worked on the Safe and Healthy Community initiative program at Penn State. Their goal is to train 5% of CC adults by the end of 2021. They have already trained over 5000 adults in our country and can offer training at many different organizations.

Katie encouraged all to share the word and share her email address <u>kwalters@chesco.org</u> and flyers.

Questions: If a child is abused and you need to reach out to police, are the local police best? PA has a designated hotline and the operator will take details and send a team.

How might dentists pick up on abuse?. All adults can notice signs. You may be the trusted adult.

Since this program is focused 100% on adults, what's the school program? The school-based program is Safe Touches- with 2nd graders. The grant for that program was lost but the DA is hoping it will return.

What are the silent signs of child sexual abuse? There has been an increase in online crimes against children. Therefore, having conversations with children about abuse is important.

PA has been ahead of the curve because of the Sandusky incident. We have experienced the need for background checks and limitations to our Exchange program.

Most cases come from Oxford, Coatesville. Stressed teachers and Daycare-levels may be higher in these areas and is linked to child abuse.

Most categories- Camp counselor, Ministers, Priests, ett. have had to go through training.

Doug Meis presented her with a Rotary gift in thanks.

President Steve pointed out that good things can come out after the Sandusky case; the Child Advocacy Center was established.
